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KIWASH's integrated approach contributes to the fight against extreme poverty by providing safe water to reduce illnesses that cripple productivity; increasing the supply and consumption of nutritious foods through irrigation and behavior change activities; and building and building household and community prosperity through increased incomes and economic productivity. KIWASH's approach to achieving significant change within the Kenyan WASH/Nutrition sectors focuses on:

- Strengthening the operations and improving the financial performance of WSPs, so that they are able to improve WASH service delivery and more effectively secure outside financing for network upgrades and expansion.
- Effectively engaging diverse private sector actors in the delivery of water and sanitation services, so that households benefit from improved and more affordable services and products.
- Combining improved citizen understanding with actions to improve hygiene practices and the consumption of more diverse and nutritious foods to dramatically reduce the incidence of diarrheal disease and malnutrition in targeted households, communities and counties.


